

ORDINANCE NO. 13, 2005

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 3, 2000, PROVIDING FOR RESIDENTIAL SEWER RATE ADJUSTMENT DURING THE SUMMER MONTHS FOR OUTDOOR WATER USES AND FIXING A TIME WHEN THE SAME SHALL TAKE EFFECT

WHEREAS, the Common Council wishes to provide a residential sewer rate adjustment during the summer months for outdoor water uses.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council of the City of Lawrence, Indiana, as follows:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 3, 2000, is hereby amended by the further amendment of Section 301 of Ordinance No. 27, 1988, which amended Ordinance No. 2, 1978, by the addition of Section 301.5 to read as follows:

301.5 The residential sewage service billing which occurs in each of the months July, August and September of each year shall be based upon the average quantity of water used during the water billing cycles ending in the months of March, April and May preceding such months of July, August and September. Averages resulting in fractions of one thousand (1000) gallons shall be raised to the next whole thousand gallons in computing the billings for the months of July, August and September. For those residential sewage service users who do not have a water usage average for the cycles ending in the months of March, April and May, the sewage service billing for the months of July, August and September shall be based upon actual water usage.

SECTION 2. All other provisions of Ordinance No. 27, 1988 and Ordinance No. 2, 1978, as amended, shall continue in full force and effect.

SECTION 3. The provisions of this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its adoption by the Common Council and approval by the Mayor.
