Council President Lisa Chavis called the meeting to order at 6:38 p.m. and announced a quorum was present.

COMMENTS OF COUNCIL MEMBERS: Councilor Whitfield acknowledged May 16-May 22, 2021 as the 46th National EMS week. The week features the theme: "Caring for Communities". She went on to thank City of Lawrence EMS personnel for their quick response times. Councilor Shevlot reported that he had attended last week the unveiling of the permanent memorial for Police Officer Craig Herbert. He commented that it was a "beautiful ceremony" and was well attended. Councilor Chavis thanked Councilor Shevlot for attending the ceremony on behalf of the council. She noted that it is often difficult for council members to attend such events. She went on to remind everyone about the Freije groundbreaking scheduled for Friday morning, May 21, 2021, is at 7:30am. She also reminded everyone of the VIP event for the Arts for Lawrence Cultural Campus also scheduled for Friday at 5:45pm. She concluded by emphasizing that all members of the Common Council have a responsibility to maintain a level of respectful decorum at meetings. She will not tolerate any level of disrespect for any reason. Councilor Freeman thanked DPW for patching pot holes in District 3. Also, for addressing high weeds and grass in ways that keep Lawrence clean and picked up. A couple of residents in her neighborhood were not in compliance for weeds and tall grass. Councilor Wells asked if there had been any indications from the Governor about when it is going to be possible to return to regular, in-person council meetings. Council Chavis responded by saying that there will be a resolution introduced at the next council meeting addressing Councilor Wells question.
