






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FLEET REPLACEMENT

Funding for the purchase of new police vehicles, further continuing the 5-year fleet replacement program

NEW FIRE ENGINE

Purchase of a new fire engine, marking a significant milestone - complete replacement of the entire Fire fleet

Continued emphasis on funding for police officer training - in excess of over 400% increase since 2016

This is an exciting time for the Lawrence Fire Department! As we continue to serve our community with pride in the year 2020, we also have hit a huge milestone. This is the first time in the history of our department that we will have completely replaced all of our frontline fire apparatus and ambulances in the city; this was all in 4 years. We are also replacing our 12-year-old SCBA packs (Self Contained Breathing Apparatus) the tanks firefighters wear on their backs while firefighting.

When citizens expect firefighters to do their job with proficiency, we must give them the safest and most modern tools to do so. We are also very excited about replacing Fire Station 38 on McCoy Street which is 34 years old.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN 2020


- Funding for new play ground equipment at Alexander Park




QUADRUPLED GENERAL FUND OPERATING RESERVE IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS

- · Fourth consecutive balanced budget
- Our savings account has never been stronger we will maintain a 20% operating reserve for the second consecutive year (compared to 13.3% for the State of Indiana!)
- Provides a strong safety net against unexpected emergencies
