

## September 23, 2025 - Superintendent's Report

## **ADMIN UPDATE:**

The Utility is seeking approval to purchase the security camera system and installation of equipment quoted by EXOS for \$30,087.02 at the Utility Operations Building and Payment Lobby. The system that is being installed with this purchase will allow us to add and upgrade additional security cameras to all of the Lawrence Utilities facilities at various locations to ensure that our water and wastewater assets remain secure and protected as we are able to phase them into our budget in the future.

American Structurepoint has completed the Inflow and Infiltration Study of the Private Sanitary Sewer System for the Harrison Point Apartments. The Utility along with Structurepoint will be contacting the owner and management of the apartment complex to inform them of the results of the study and inform them that they will need to complete all of the necessary repairs to eliminate the sources of I/I that they are introducing into the City's municipal sanitary sewer system. This is the fourth private sanitary sewer system that the Utilities have worked with Structurepoint to identify sources of I/I to remove in areas identified in the Administrative Order on Consent issued by the EPA for chronic sanitary sewer overflows.

The pre-construction meeting for the Indian Creek Bridge Rehabilitation Project in the Fort Harrison Well Field has been scheduled for September 24, 2025, with Egis-BLN, Hoosier Pride Excavating, and Lawrence Utilities. In the meeting we will be discussing the start date which was tentatively scheduled for the beginning of October 2025.

The Utility is seeking approval of the Professional Services Agreement with Baker Tilly for a not to exceed amount of \$25,000.00 (\$12,500.00 water & \$12,500.00 sewer) for the 2026 Water & Sewer Utility Budget Preparation Assistance. (The same service that was performed in 2024 for the 2025 Budget preparation)

## **Account Adjustments:**

 7142 Dewester Drive – customer is requesting a sanitary sewer adjustment for \$1891.88 due to slab leak. We recommend approval.

This is a 2-month adjustment. Consumption has returned to normal usage.
