## CITY OF LAWRENCE Common Council June 2, 2025 Regular Meeting

President Cramer called the meeting to order at 6:31 p.m. The pledge of allegiance was administered, followed by a moment of silence.

President Cramer recognized there was a quorum. It was also recognized there were extra copies of the agenda located at the back of the room along with a sign-up sheet for comments from the citizens.

<u>COMMENTS OF COUNCIL MEMBERS</u>: Councilor Freeman thanked the administration for sending a notification letter to CSX regarding necessary train track repairs.

Councilor Masur shared an update on the pollinator-friendly plantings funded several years ago. The gardens, covering nearly five acres, are thriving. She encouraged the public to visit, noting that the *hairy beardtongue* is currently in bloom.

Councilor Krone also shared the following:

### • Sunset Cove HOA & Water Leak:

- Reported ongoing liaison efforts between Sunset Cove HOA and Citizens Energy regarding a water leak at 7974 Glen View Drive (off Fox Road).
- o Technician assessed the site today; follow-up call scheduled for tomorrow.
- Councilor Krone conducted a site visit and believed a resolution is possible without DPW involvement.

## • Crossing South Neighborhood – Footbridge Repair:

- Constituent reported a deteriorating wooden footbridge at the neighborhood entrance (south of 86th Street).
- Councilor Krone confirmed the structure is splintered, broken, and dry rotted.
- Will contact DPW for potential repairs.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>: 1) Re-zoning – 25-ZON-01 (Advertised Public Hearing)
Clerk Adkisson read the re-zoning docket number, address and the request for this hearing. Below are the details:

- Address: 7848 Pendleton Pike, Lawrence, IN 46226
- Current Zoning: Split between C5 (Commercial) and I3 (Industrial)
- **Petition Request:** Owner seeks to rezone entire parcel to C5 to unify zoning and expand permitted uses (e.g. salon, laundromat, convenience store).
- **Petitioner:** Thomas Pottschmidt, engineer from Omega Engineering (representing property owner).

## Mr. Pottschmidt pointed out the possible issues listed below:

- Upcoming zoning overlay may convert **C5 to C4**, which restricts uses (notably auto sales).
- The owner is undecided due to uncertainty about future zoning overlays and implications.

## **Council Concerns**

- **Councilor Giles**: Strongly opposed to any future use as a **used car lot**, a use permitted under C5 but not under C4.
- Director, Public Works, (Renea Rafala) explained:
  - Proposed uses (convenience store, salon, laundromat) are not allowed in I3.
  - o These uses would be allowed in **C4**, which aligns with city redevelopment goals.
  - Mayor and staff are actively working on a zoning overhaul to control undesired uses on Pendleton Pike.

#### Result

- The petitioner withdrew the rezoning request.
- Councilor Jennings moved motion to deny 25-ZON-01. Councilor Giles 2<sup>nd</sup>. The roll call vote was taken. Motion passed unanimously.
- The council encouraged the owner to return with clearer plans aligned with community priorities.
