Lawrence Police Department Citizen Academy

Concept:

The Lawrence Police Department's Citizen Academy is a contemporary concept in Law Enforcement-Community relations. The Lawrence Police Department Citizen Academy serves as a part of a continuing program to develop citizen awareness and understanding of the role of local law enforcement. It is important to understand that the Citizens Academy is **NOT** a "citizens on patrol" project, and participants receive absolutely **NO** special police powers, authority, or responsibility.

Challenge:

Our continuing challenge is to develop strategies that will increase the understanding of the role law enforcement plays in our community, and of the citizens we serve. The results will benefit our Department's effectiveness in assisting with problems. The Lawrence Police Department Citizen Academy functions as an added resource to the community to increase this understanding.

Goals:

In our continuing efforts to develop community awareness through education, the Lawrence Police Department Citizen Academy will produce better informed citizens with a deeper understanding of the Lawrence Police Department and the role law enforcement plays in the community. The Lawrence Police Department Citizen Academy will promote the concept of *Together Everyone Achieves More*. This will create better teamwork and cooperation between the Lawrence Police Department and the citizens we serve.

Program:

The Lawrence Police Department Citizen Academy is an 11-week program. The program consists of weekly 3-hour classes that include lectures, hands-on learning and role-playing scenarios. Citizens will be *required* to complete a ride-along with a patrol officer. This program will provide an overview of the professional training that Lawrence Police Department officers receive and how we function to provide the highest level of service and protection to the community. Participants must be at least 21 years old prior to the start of the Citizens Academy.

Focus:

Graduates of the Lawrence Police Department Citizen Academy will gain an improved understanding of the Lawrence Police Department's policing function and will be able to better assist officers in identifying and resolving problems in their community. This will improve the efficiency of the Lawrence Police Department and raise the quality of life enjoyed by citizens of the community.

Personal Appearance, Dress Code and Behavior Policy

and in addition to the stipulations set forth in the "Assumption of Risk",
I,, do hereby agree to conform to
the following policy adopted by the Lawrence Police Department.
It is further understood that violation of any part of this policy will result in the immediate revocation of permission to accompany an employee of the Lawrence Police Department.
Personal Appearance:
All civilian citizen academy attendees, and passengers in police vehicles, should present a neat and clear appearance, not excessive, ragged, unkempt, or extreme in appearance.
Dress Code:
All civilian citizen academy participants should do their part to project a professional image of the Department. All attendees and passengers must wear a shirt or blouse with collar and sleeves, which will remain either tucked in or cover the mid-section at all times. Trousers must be full length, skirts or dresses must extend at least to the kneecap. Denim is acceptable, provided (as with all garments) there is no fraying, tears, or inappropriate, unprofessional appearance. Outerwear and shoes are to be clean, with no open toed or sandal style shoes (except for graduation night).
At no time should any garment be displayed that would be considered as offensive or in bad taste to the community.
Behavior Policy:
No person shall be a passenger, or accompany any employee of the Lawrence Police Department while under the influence of alcohol or drugs. The odor of alcohol is sufficiently presumptive evidence to constitute 'being under the influence". Passengers in police vehicles should comply with all lawful or reasonable requests from the officer they are riding with, or come in contact with.
All passengers should conduct themselves at all times in a manner that reflects well on themselves and the Lawrence Police Department.
